PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

How quickly **Term One** has flown as we head into the final week before the break. As always it has been a very eventful term with many wonderful achievements and experiences for our students.

One of the big talking points has been the **Production for 2017 – High School Musical**. Auditions have been completed, cast and crew have been chosen and rehearsals are well underway. Congratulations to all those students involved including singers and musicians who will all play a role in ensuring it's a fantastic production.

Swimming Sports were held at the Pines Pool and there were some outstanding performances on the day with more than 40 students going through to the District competition last week. While we had some great times and personal bests, only one student managed to get through the very fierce competition and go through to the zone competition. Congratulations to all those students who did so well.

The College **Athletics Day** this week was full of promise with all houses trying to out-do each other in their team colours. The staff have been very busy getting the colour coded costumes ready and ensured they contributed to the excitement and atmosphere on the day. As always, Ballam Park provides great opportunities for the wide range of athletic events undertaken on the day. I am very proud to see so many students really get involved and strive for their personal best results.

Term One has seen some great work undertaken in the central courtyard, with the **Shade Sails** installed, just in time for some very hot days. As the workers were doing the final checks, students had moved in to enjoy the shade. It is quite a stunning installation. A purpose built and designed sail – it looks great.



The long awaited **rocks** donated to the school by Hillview Quarry arrived and after a long day of bobcat, crowbar and shovel work, are now in place around the school. They provide great seating and really add to the plantings and work undertaken over the past 18 months by students. Thank you to the parents and the staff who assisted on the day.

Term One has seen a number of our highly able students of Mathematics involved in an on-line program offered to Mount Erin Students through **The John Monash School of Science**. This is a really prestigious program and the students have been provided with great opportunities to extend their skills and interests and link in with students and teachers from other schools.

On-Demand testing has been completed for all students in Years 7-10 and will provide some base line data for teachers about student performance. This will be one set of data used and students will be re-tested later in the year to monitor their progress and development.

Over the past two weeks we have had a series of **Immersion Days** for students wanting to sample some of our Year 7 programs. The interest has been really positive with very high numbers of students participating from a wide range of primary schools. It's a great way for them to experience secondary school and sample some of the programs on offer at the College. Well done to all the staff and student leaders involved.

We had a very positive visit to **Kingsley Park Primary School** where past students went with Mr Bowers to speak to current Grade 5 & 6 students and their parents. They did a great job as ambassadors for the College and I congratulate each one of them.

Last Friday evening, I had the pleasure of officiating with Paul Edbrooke, our local Member for Frankston in the Victorian Parliament, at the **Presentation Ball** for our Year 11 students. It was a great evening and families and friends were there to see the students perform the dance routines they have been learning since the start of the year. The couples looked sensational and their dancing was quite exceptional. It really reinforces what can be done when you practice, take on board feedback for improvement and commit to mastering new skills. The students were all very proud of themselves, as were their parents, families and friends. Well done to Ms Leah Olsen, the Year 11 Wellbeing Leader who has ensured all aspects of the Presentation Ball were so well organised.

Dear Parent/Guardian,

This letter is to remind families who wish for their children who pay to use a Charter Bus including the Pearcedale Charter Bus (as well as those students who **pay to travel** on the Pearcedale, Tyabb or Hastings Buses) in Term 2 that there is a \$100 per student cost which is payable in advance.

To make a payment, please contact Erin in the General Office. Payments can be made via credit card or BPay.

I have arranged for students who pay to travel on the Pearcedale Charter Bus (as well as those students who **pay to travel** on the Pearcedale, Tyabb or Hastings Buses) to use their current Bus Pass for the first 3 days of Term 2 to enable payments to be made at the start of the term and to provide time for new Bus Passes to be issued.

From Thursday 17th April only students who have paid and been issued with new Bus Passes will be able to travel on the Pearcedale Charter Bus This also applies to those students who pay to travel on the Pearcedale, Tyabb or Hastings Buses) .

Mount Erin College is subsidising the cost of the Pearcedale Charter Bus in order to keep the cost to families as low as possible.



Tell us about your hobbies or passion outside of school.


Born in Wales I am a die-hard Rugby Union fan, I have also been known to cheer on Liverpool FC.


